



#### Part Identification

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


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Assemble your unit on a carpeted floor or on the empty carton to avoid scratching your unit or the floor.

- Fasten the CONNECTORS (D) to one of the ENDS (A). Use four BLACK 1/2" MACHINE SCREWS (2).
- <u>NOTE</u>: Be sure the holes in the CONNECTORS line up with the holes in the END.
- Then, fasten the other END (A) into the CONNECTORS (D). Use four BLACK 1/2" MACHINE SCREWS (2).





- NOTE: Do not completely tighten the SCREWS in the FRAMES. Start each SCREW a few turns in each FRAME before completely tightening any of them.
- Fasten the FRAMES (B and C) to the ENDS (A). Use sixteen BLACK 1/2" MACHINE SCREWS (2) through the tabs on the ENDS and into the holes in the FRAMES.
- <u>NOTE</u>: Be sure the hole in the back edge of the TOP FRAME (B) is facing down towards the floor.

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
Carefully stand your unit upright.

Stick a BUMPER (1) onto each tab on the FRAMES (B and C).

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Pro Tip: Lift with your legs. And, you know, your arms.




#### **A**Caution


Tempered safety glass is used. It is stronger than normal glass, and it will not break into long, sharp, knife-like shards. However, safety glass *can break*. When safety glass breaks, it instantly fractures into small, bead-like pieces. These small pieces may have sharp edges.

For your safety, follow these precautions when you assemble your product:

- Wear safety glasses or other eye protection.
- Do not try to drill into or cut safety glass. It will instantly break into small pieces.
- Do not force the glass into position.
- If the glass breaks, be careful when you pick up the pieces. They may have sharp edges.
- Carefully place the GLASS SHELVES (E) onto the tabs on the FRAMES (B and C).



- We recommend using the FURNITURE TIPPING RESTRAINT KIT (99) for added stability. Fasten a bracket to the back edge of the TOP FRAME (B) using the 5/8" screw as shown.
- Place your unit in its final location against a wall.
- NOTE: The tack glides on your unit can be adjusted.
- Follow the instructions included in the KIT to fasten your unit to the wall.
- NOTE: Please read the back pages of the instruction booklet for important safety information.
- This completes assembly. Clean with your favorite furniture polish or a damp cloth. Wipe dry.
