



| С | TOP SHELF (1)   |








- Assemble your unit on a carpeted floor or on the empty carton to avoid scratching your unit or the floor.
- Unfold the METAL FRAME (B) upside down and fasten it to the TOP SHELF (C) as shown. Turn two FASTENERS (1) through the METAL FRAME and into the TOP SHELF (C).




Fasten the SHELVES (A) to the METAL FRAME (B). Turn eight FASTENERS (1) through the METAL FRAME and into the SHELVES (A).



- Carefully stand your unit upright.
- We recommend using the FURNITURE TIPPING RESTRAINT KITS (99) for added stability. Fasten the brackets to the back edge of the TOP SHELF (C) using the 5/8" screw as shown.
- ▼ Place your unit in its final location against a wall.
- Follow the instructions included in the KIT to fasten your unit to the wall.



- NOTE: Please read the back pages of the instruction booklet for important safety information.
- This completes assembly. Clean with your favorite furniture polish or a damp cloth. Wipe dry.
