## ABT Dual Brush Pens

2 tips, 107 vivid, water-based colors: the fibre pen for maximum creativity!

The fine tip (line thickness 0.8 mm ) can be used anywhere where precise lines are required, the second tip (The line thickness of the brush tip varies depending on the pressure exerted and can be up to approx. 10 mm ) is wide and flexible like a brush. Available in 107 luminous colors as well as a colorless Blender.


The Blender Pen contains uncolored waterbased ink. Use the Blender Pen to mix and blend your colors easily. For smoother color graduations, dip the Blender Pen into water first.

Alternatively, you can also put color to paper with the Blender Pen. The tip of the Blender Pen can either be used for direct coloring (see Blending Effects) or the desired color can be applied to smooth surfaces such as a CD and the color created with the Blender Pen. In this way you also have the opportunity to mix your own colors.


Press the tips of two ABTs together. The tip of the bottom pen absorbs the color of the upper pen. Now use the bottom pen with color to create a blending effect on the paper. Afterwards use the pen with color onto a neutral bit of paper again to "paint it clean"

If you like to color your stamp prints, you should use a permanent pen, e.g Tombow MONO twin or an inkpads with waterproof ink. This avoids blending the outline while coloring

Tip: For a more vivid look for your motif, use a grey shaded color like N75 to outline the border or motive.


You may also color your stamp directly with the "ABTs". For letter stamps or simple outlines, only use one color. For more complex outlines or colorful results you should use various colors.

Tip: After coloring, blow on to the color on the stamp. This refreshes the color and results in a more precise outline on the paper.

## Hand Lettering

For fine lines remove pressure [a]. For thicker lines, increase pressure on the brush tip [b].
